National Prescription Drug Take Back Initiative Set for Tomorrow

On Saturday, September 26, 2015, the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) will coordinate and facilitate a National Prescription Drug Take Back Initiative to remove potentially dangerous controlled substances as well as other unused, unwanted, and unneeded pharmaceuticals from homes. The purpose of this initiative is to provide a unified opportunity for the public to surrender dispensed pharmaceuticals and medications to law enforcement officers for destruction.

Collection sites for this event are the 1D, 2D, 3D, 4D, 5D, 6D, and 7D Stations, and the 1D and 4D Substations.

Each facility shall provide available space (i.e., lobby, community room, etc.) for this event. The event will be from 1000-1400 hours. Any questions pertaining to the Take Back event should be directed to **Acting Lieutenant Andrew Struhar** on **(202) 359-7778**.

National Sickle Cell Month

September is National Sickle Cell Awareness Month. First officially recognized by the federal government in 1983, National Sickle Cell Awareness Month calls attention to sickle cell disease (SCD), a genetic disease that researchers estimate affects between 90,000 and 100,000 Americans. Sickle Cell Disease is most common in West and Central Africa where as many as 25

percent of the people have sickle cell trait and one to two percent of all babies are born with a form of the disease. In the United States with an estimated population of over 270 million, about 1,000 babies are born with sickle cell disease each year.

Register for 2015 Promotional Selection Process Through LMS by October 2

Members who wish to apply for the 2015 Promotional Selection Process shall register for the 2015 Promotional Selection Process using the Metropolitan Police Department's Learning Management System (LMS) beginning Friday, September 11, 2015, at 1530 hours. The application period will end **Friday, October 2, 2015**, at 2359 hours. No exemptions will be made for late applications.

All officers, sergeants, and lieutenants on the Department will be sent an email from envisagenow.com with the subject line "Online Event Assignment Notification".

Members not interested in and/or those who do not meet the eligibility criteria for the 2015 Promotional Selection Process should take no action. Interested members meeting the eligibility criteria for the 2015 Promotional Selection Process should complete the application in the MPD Learning Management System (LMS) by click-


ing the link provided in the email or by logging into their LMS account and launching and then completing the application.

Members must complete the application by answering all questions and ensuring that they follow the instructions provided at the end of the application.

Note that submitting an application through LMS indicates a certification of meeting all eligibility requirements listed in Circular 15-05 or Circular 15-06. The submission of an application indicates that the candidate also acknowledges that the failure to provide accurate and complete information may subject him or her to an investigation, and if sustained, disciplined up to and including termination.
