DESCRIPTION OF INCIDENT

At approximately 4:00 pm on Tuesday, October 13, 2009, officers assigned to the Sixth District and DC Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department personnel responded to the 5300 block of Clay Terrace, NE to investigate the report of a shooting. Upon arrival, they discovered five male victims ranging in age from 15–18 years of age suffering from gunshot wounds. Two of the victims died as a result of their injuries. They are 15-year-old **Davonta Artis** of the 300 block of 54th Street, NE and 18-year-old **Daquan Tibbs** of the 200 block of 37th Street, NE.

The Metropolitan Police Department seeks the public's assistance in gathering information regarding this incident. A reward of **up to \$50,000** is being offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the individuals responsible in this incident.
