### DESCRIPTION OF INCIDENT

On Saturday, January 21, 2006, at approximately 3 am, a victim was assaulted in the 2300 block of 18th Street, NW. The victim, identified as 34-year-old **Marc Jonathan Ficarra**, of the 600 block of Romford Drive in Hyattsville, Maryland, was admitted to the Washington Hospital Center in critical condition until his death. He was pronounced dead at 12:45 pm on Sunday, January 31, 2006. Reportedly, Ficarra was assaulted by three male suspects following a verbal altercation. A 25-year-old male and a 21-year-old female were also assaulted during this same incident. They went to an area hospital via private vehicles and were treated and released.

One of the suspects is described as a medium-complexioned black male with a slim build, about 5'8" tall, 20-30 years old, wearing a blue hooded shirt, a blue jacket and blue jeans. The other two suspects are described only black males, who are believed to be in their twenties.
