FINAL QUARTER REPORT ON DONATIONS APPROVED BY OPGD FOR FY 2002

Pursuant to Mayor's Order 2002-2 dated January 11, 2002, the Director of the Office of Partnerships and Grants Development (OPGD), in consultation with the Office of the Corporation Counsel's Ethics Counselor, has published the District's final Quarterly Report on Donations for Fiscal Year 2002. The Order requires the OPGD Director to review all requests by District officials to solicit or accept donations and approve or disapprove such requests as appropriate in accordance with the Rules of Conduct Governing Donations (Mayor's Memorandum 2002-1) and Section 115 of the 2002 D.C. Appropriations Act. This report contains data on all donations approved by the Director for the period beginning July 1, 2002 and ending September 30, 2002. During this period, the OPGD Director approved the solicitation and/or acceptance of \$889,882 in donations of which \$91,050 represented financial contributions, and \$798,832 represented in-kind contributions.
