VICTIM'S RIGHTS



You have the right to ...



- You have the right to ...
- » Call 9-1-1 for immediate medical care and use resources listed on the opposite side to assist you with compensation for that care, as well as other costs associated with the crime;
- Be treated with fairness and with respect for the victim's dignity and privacy;
- » Be reasonably protected from the accused offender;
- » Be notified of court proceedings;

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- » Be present at all court proceedings related to the offense, including the sentencing, and release or parole hearings, unless the court determines that testimony by the victim would be materially affected if the victim heard other testimony or where the needs of justice otherwise require;
- Confer with an attorney for the prosecution in the case, which does not include the authority to direct the prosecution of the case;
- » An order of restitution from the person convicted of the criminal conduct that caused the victim's loss or injury; and
- » Information about the conviction, sentencing, imprisonment, detention, and release of offender.
- » Be notified of any available victim advocate or other appropriate person to develop a safety plan and appropriate services.
