Dear Mr. Pardoe:

This letter is in response to the above-referenced Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for the following:

“...a photograph of Robert E. Askins. He was arrested multiple times in Washington DC, the last time being in the 1970's. I know that a photo exists of him - it may be in the files related to the Freeway Phantom killings. Askins is dead - he died in prison. I desire a digital or good hard copy of him. You should have booking photos of him on file. I have been told by former officers that one exists of him.”

A review indicates that we do not have a record of having received an agreement to pay for FOIA processing services, such as for time to search for records that may be responsive to your request, in accordance with the October 29, 2018, acknowledgement letter. Therefore, we have closed our case file for this FOIA request. You may resubmit your request, along with a statement of willingness to pay potential processing fees.

Please know that, under D.C. Official Code § 2-537 and 1 DCMR § 412, you have the right to appeal this letter to the Mayor or to the Superior Court of the District of Columbia. If you elect to appeal to the Mayor, your appeal must be in writing and contain “Freedom of Information Act Appeal” or “FOIA Appeal” in the subject line of the letter, as well as, on the outside of the envelope. The appeal must include (1) a copy of the original request; (2) a copy of any written denial; (3) a statement of the circumstances, reasons, and/or arguments advanced in support of disclosure; and (4) a daytime telephone number, an e-mail and/or U.S. mailing address at which you can be reached.

The appeal must be mailed to: The Mayor’s Office of Legal Counsel, FOIA Appeal, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Suite 407, Washington, D.C. 20004. Electronic versions of the same information can instead be e-mailed to The Mayor’s Office of Legal Counsel at foia.appeals@dc.gov. Further, a copy of all appeal materials must be forwarded to the Freedom

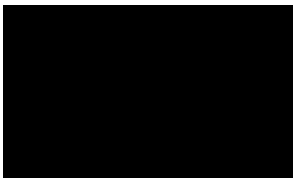

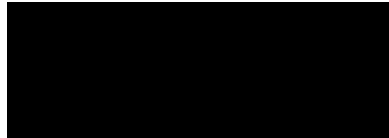

"This is a request for any and all records the Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia has regarding the "Freeway Phantom" homicide investigations. This is to include but not be limited to records consolidated within the indices of the MPDC Major Case/Cold Case Squad.

The public has a strong interest in these records, which will contribute to public understanding of the operations of MPDC. The Freeway Phantom victims were all ordinary, African-American girls with low individual-level risk factors for violence. Yet, in his book Between Good and Evil: A Master Profiler's Hunt for Society's Most Violent Predators, FBI Agent and Freeway Phantom investigator Roger L. Depue mistakenly claimed 12-year-old Phantom victim Nenomoshia Yates was "no stranger to the prostitution game."

Given the potential impacts of discriminatory attitudes on homicide investigations- it is imperative that the public gain a greater understanding of how such attitudes might have impacted the case. To that end I seek the records described below.

Requested Records:

The names of the Freeway Phantom victims were Carol Denise Spinks, Darlenia Denise Johnson, Brenda Faye Crockett, Nenomoshia Yates, Brenda Denise Woodard, Diane Williams and Teara Ann Bryant. I am requesting all records pertaining to the investigation into their murders, including but not limited to investigative reports, witness interviews, follow-up reports, photos, evidence vouchers, forensic testing results, audio and video recordings, transcripts, case jackets and crime scene examination case files. Please include searches of manual as well as computerized indices. The time frame for which I am seeking records is from April 1971 through December 2008.

If necessary, the requested records can be redacted to remove information that could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

Please note that to completely withhold records on the basis of protecting an "ongoing investigation, a public agency must make "an evidentiary showing (1) that the records are to be used in a prospective law enforcement action and (2) that the disclosure of the records would be prejudicial to such an action." 
