This letter is in response to your above referenced Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for the following:

In 1971 the Metropolitan Police released a photograph of murder victim Brenda Woodard's clothing on a mannequin to the press. This was released to the public to generate leads. I respectfully submit a request for a photograph of that mannequin in the victim's clothing.

Per a search conducted by Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) personnel, no photograph responsive to your request was located; however, the following link was posted on the MPD website: https://search.usa.gov/search?query=Brenda+Woodard&affiliate=de_mpdc&emb=1.

Be advised, the homicide of Brenda Woodard was handled by the Prince George's County Police Department. You may also wish to contact that police department for additional information.

Please know that, under D.C Official Code § 2-537 and 1 DCMR § 412, you have the right to appeal this letter to the Mayor or to the Superior Court of the District of Columbia. If you elect to appeal to the Mayor, your appeal must be in writing and contain "Freedom of Information Act Appeal" or "FOIA Appeal" in the subject line of the letter, as well as, on the outside of the envelope. The appeal must include (1) a copy of the original request; (2) a copy of any written denial; (3) a statement of the circumstances, reasons, and/or arguments advanced in support of disclosure; and (4) a daytime telephone number, an e-mail and/or U.S. mailing address at which you can be reached. The appeal must be mailed to: The Mayor's Correspondence Unit, FOIA Appeal, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Suite 407, Washington, D.C. 20004. This is in response to the above referenced Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for the following:

I am looking for the case files/autopsies on the victims of the Freeway Phantom; Carol Denise Spinks, Darlenia Denise Johnson, Brenda Faye Crockett, Nenomoshia Yates, Brenda Denise Woodward, Diane Denise Williams. I am a writer trying to look deeper into their cases and see what I can find, please help me out by giving me access to these records.

It has been determined that the information you are seeking is part of an ongoing criminal investigation. The release of this information could interfere with enforcement proceedings by revealing the direction and pace of the investigation. It could also lead to attempts to destroy or alter evidence, reveal information about potential witnesses who could then be subjected to intimidation as part of an effort to frustrate future investigative activities, or could place witnesses in danger. For these reasons information about this incident is exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 2-534 (a)(2), (a)(3)(A)(i) and (a)(3)(C).

With regards to your request for "autopsies", please be advised that the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) is not the custodian of "autopsies". You may submit your FOIA request to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner (OCME) online via the DC Government Public FOIA Portal at https://foia-dc.gov/palMain.aspx. Dear Chief Lanier,

My name is Blaine Pardoe and my daughter and I are true crime authors. We are currently working on a book on the Freeway Phantom cases from the early 1970's in Washington DC. We could use your help with our research.

We have talked to several former investigators and know that your department has lost most of the evidence and much of the investigatory files. We filed a FOIA to request redacted copies of the crime scene reports or any materials that you have. After 47 years, there is little risk of us corrupting any investigation you have. By now, most witnesses are dead, along with most suspects.

The FBI provide us with a wealth of material on the case, but your department blocked our FOIA with Prince George's County, Maryland as well, citing they were working the case. I am sure they follow-up on leads when they come in, but I seriously doubt this case is prosecutable at this stage. Over ten years ago, in 2002 the FBI released information on the 1975 Jimmy Hoffa case. Yet your department refuses to cooperate with our requests. I'm sure this is an administrative rule, but it need to be reviewed and reconsidered.

Our books on cold cases generate new tips and leads for investigators. We are confident that the same will happen with the Freeway Phantom cases.

What we are asking for two things. One, a reconsideration of our request for the case files on the Freeway Phantom cases. 


