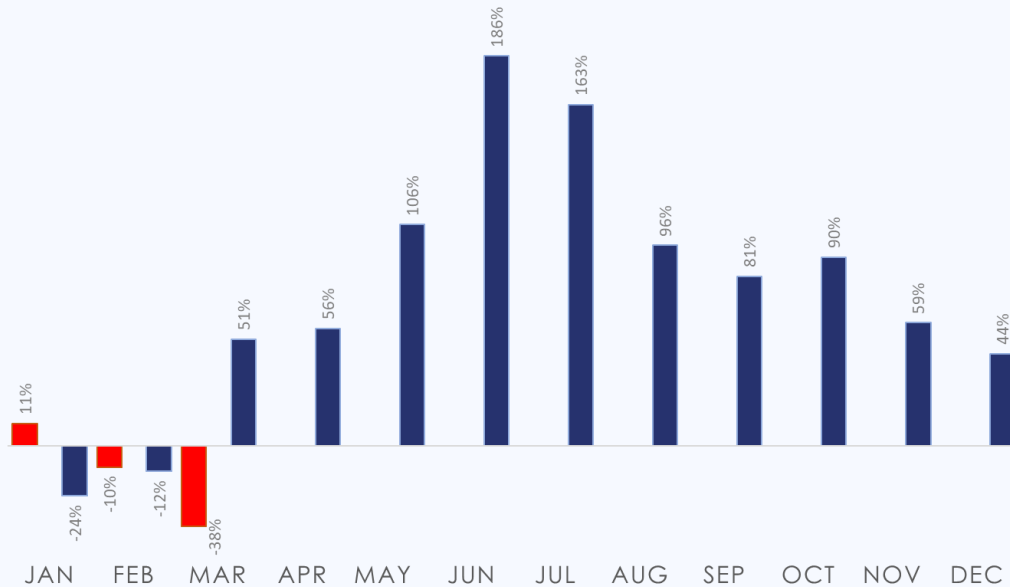

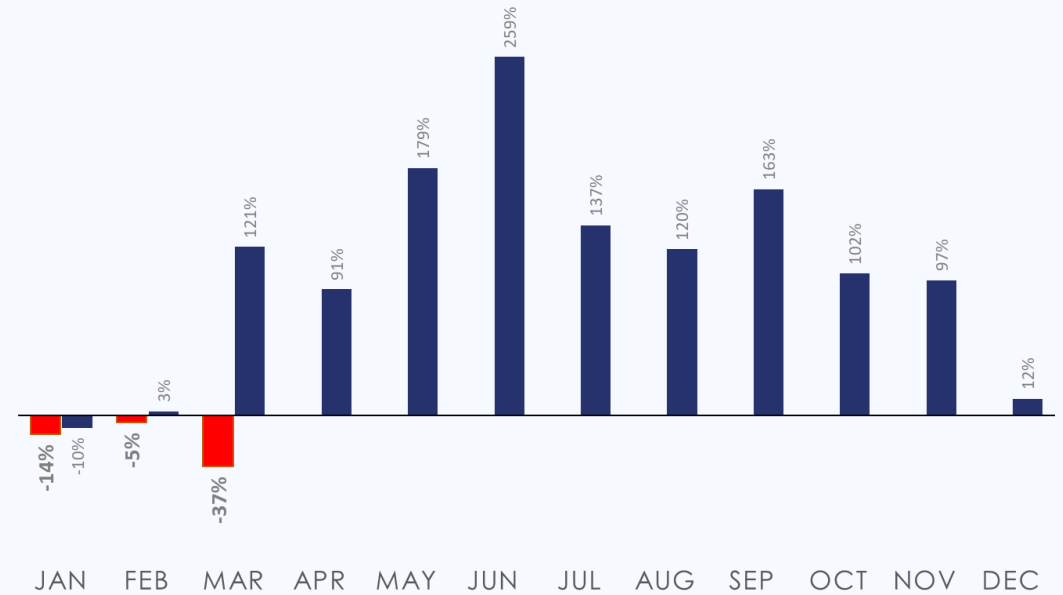
ROBBERY and CARJACKING TRENDS

As of April 1, 2024 ■ % Change, (24 v 23) ■ % Change, (23 v 22)

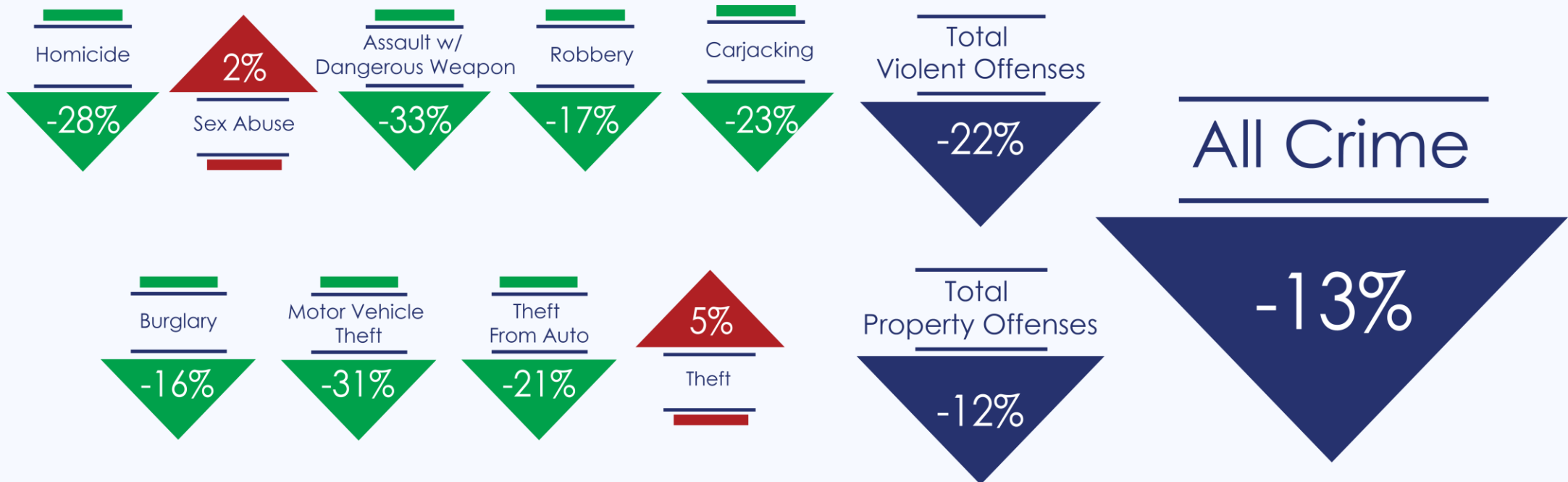
% CHANGE IN CARJACKINGS, 2024 vs 2023 AND 2023 vs 2022

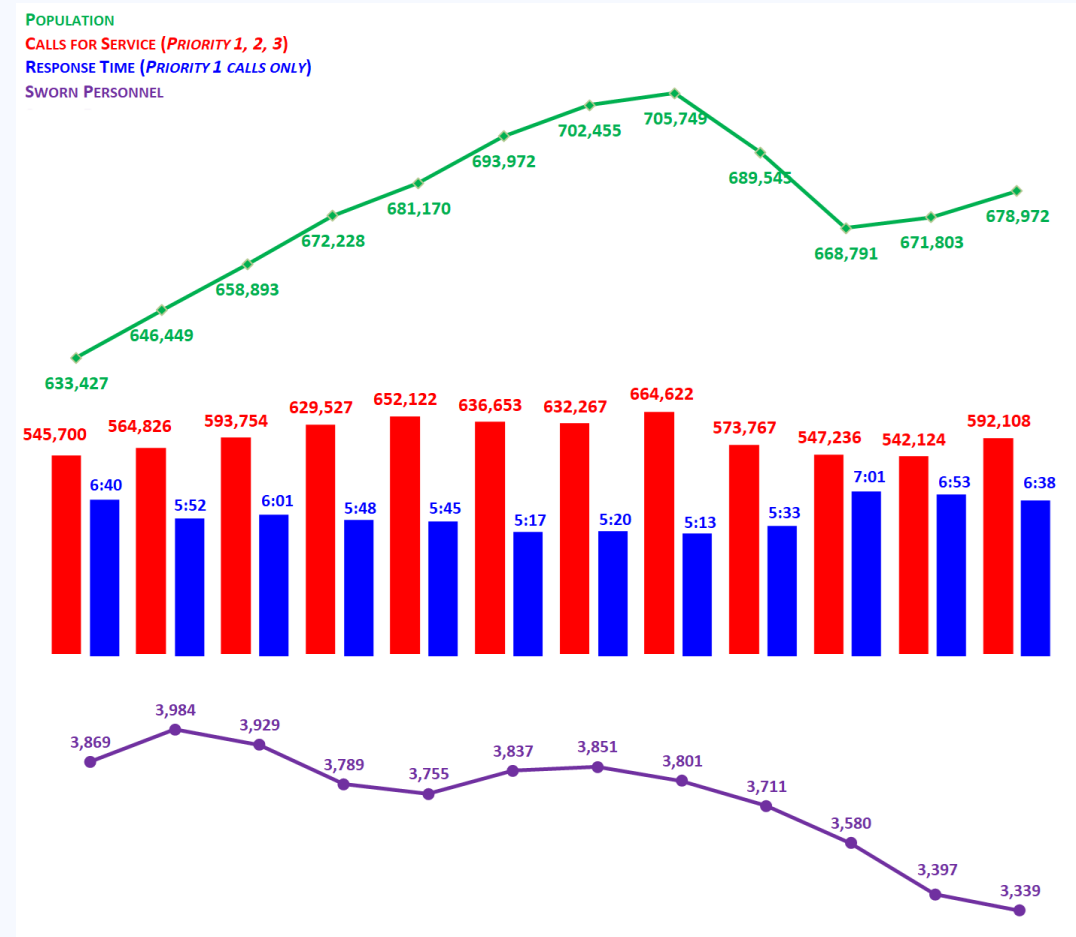


CALLS for SERVICE and RESPONSE (2012-2023)

From 2022 to 2023, DC's population **grew** and calls for service **increased**.

Yet even though the number of sworn officers continued to **decrease**, MPD responded to the most serious calls **FASTER**.

All data reflect calendar year totals, 2012-2023, except for sworn staffing, which is as of December 31 for each year.

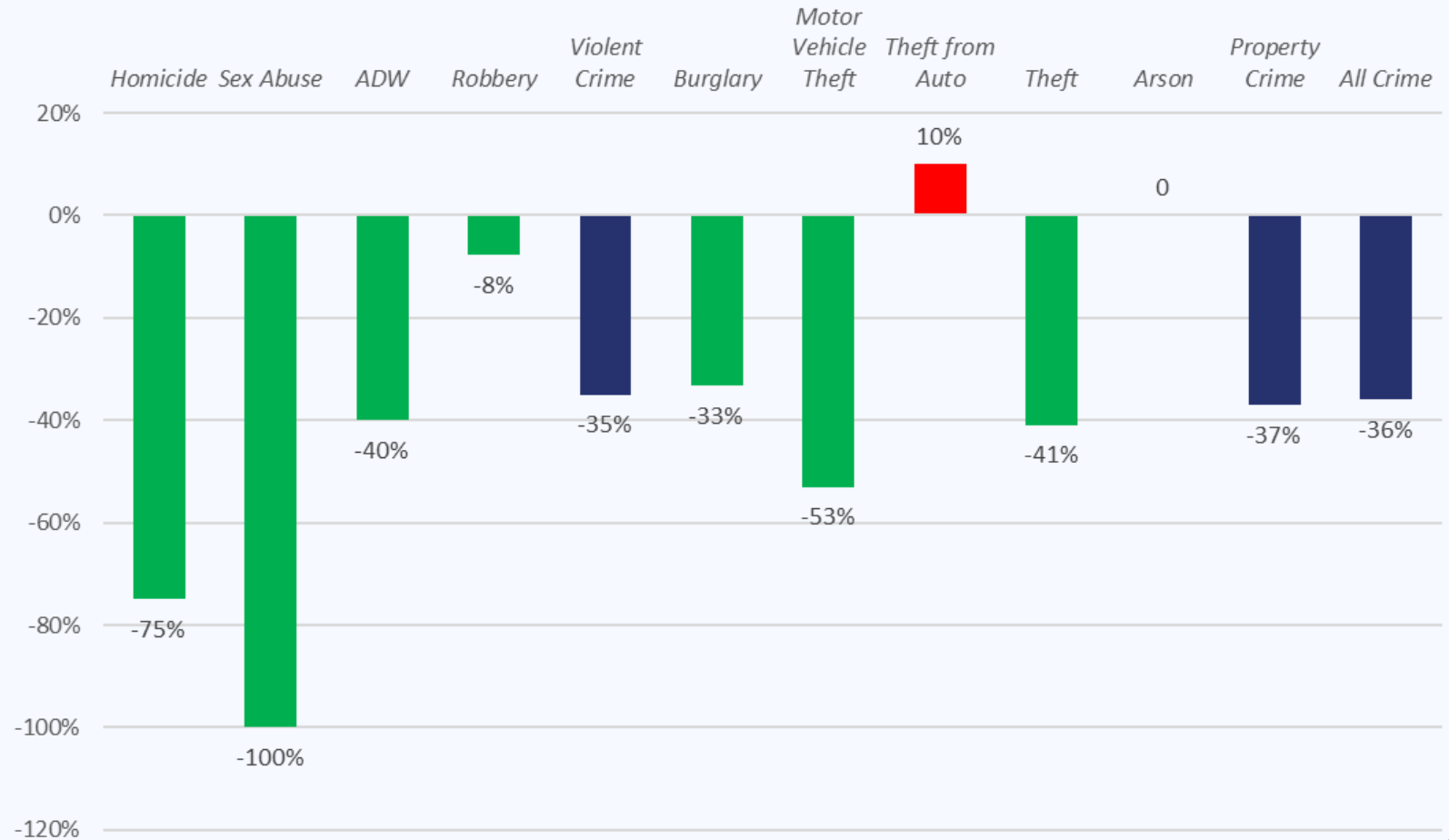

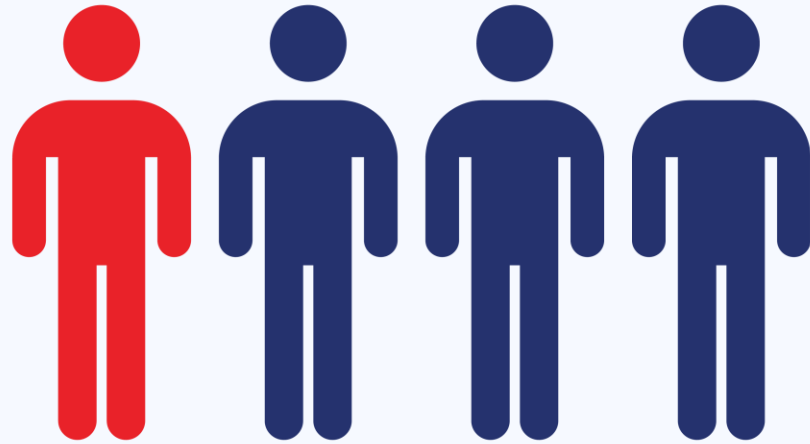
In 2023, MPD received nearly **5,500 applications** to become a recruit officer.

So far in 2024, MPD has received **47% more** applications compared to the same time in 2023.

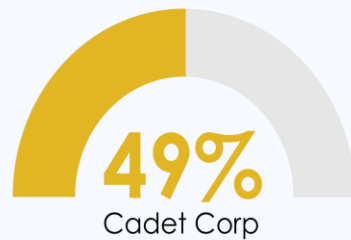

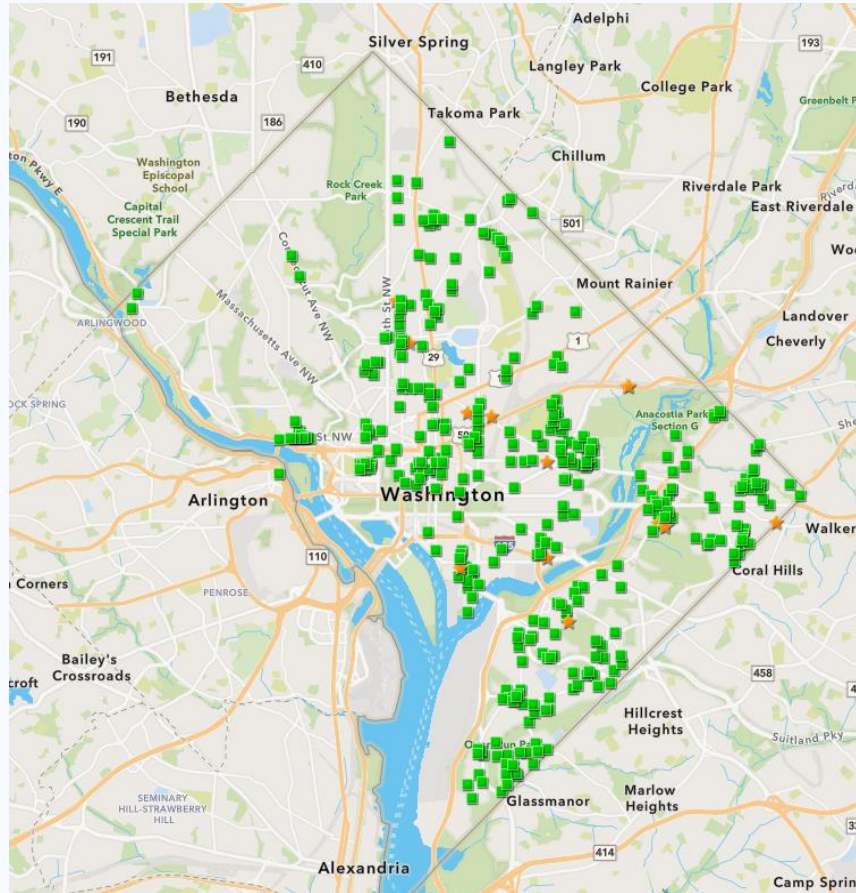

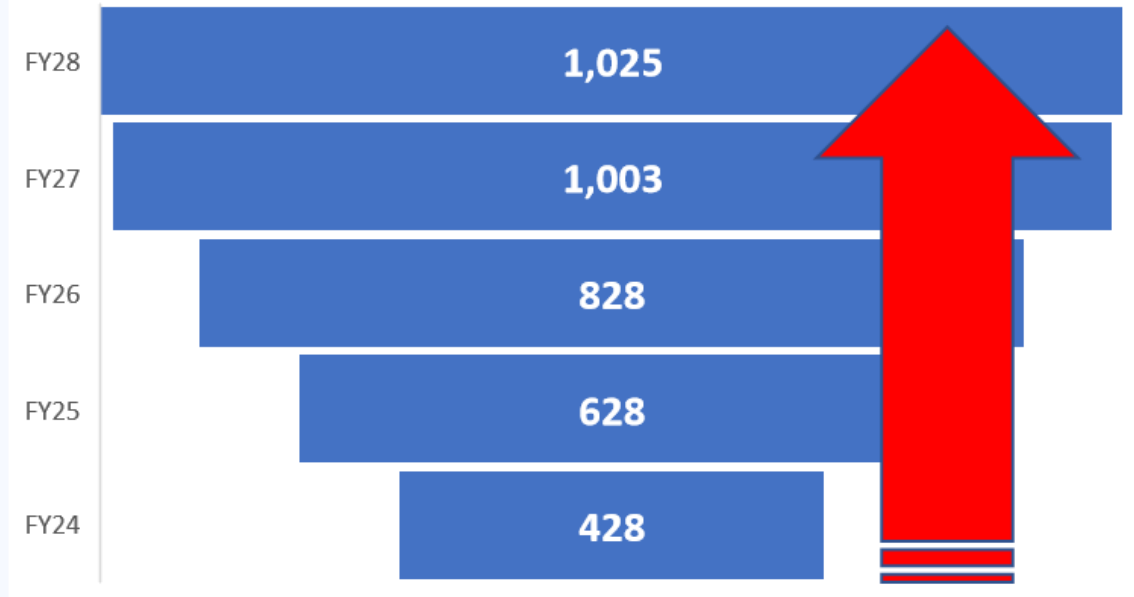

CURRENT CCTV DEPLOYMENT *and* PLANNED GROWTH

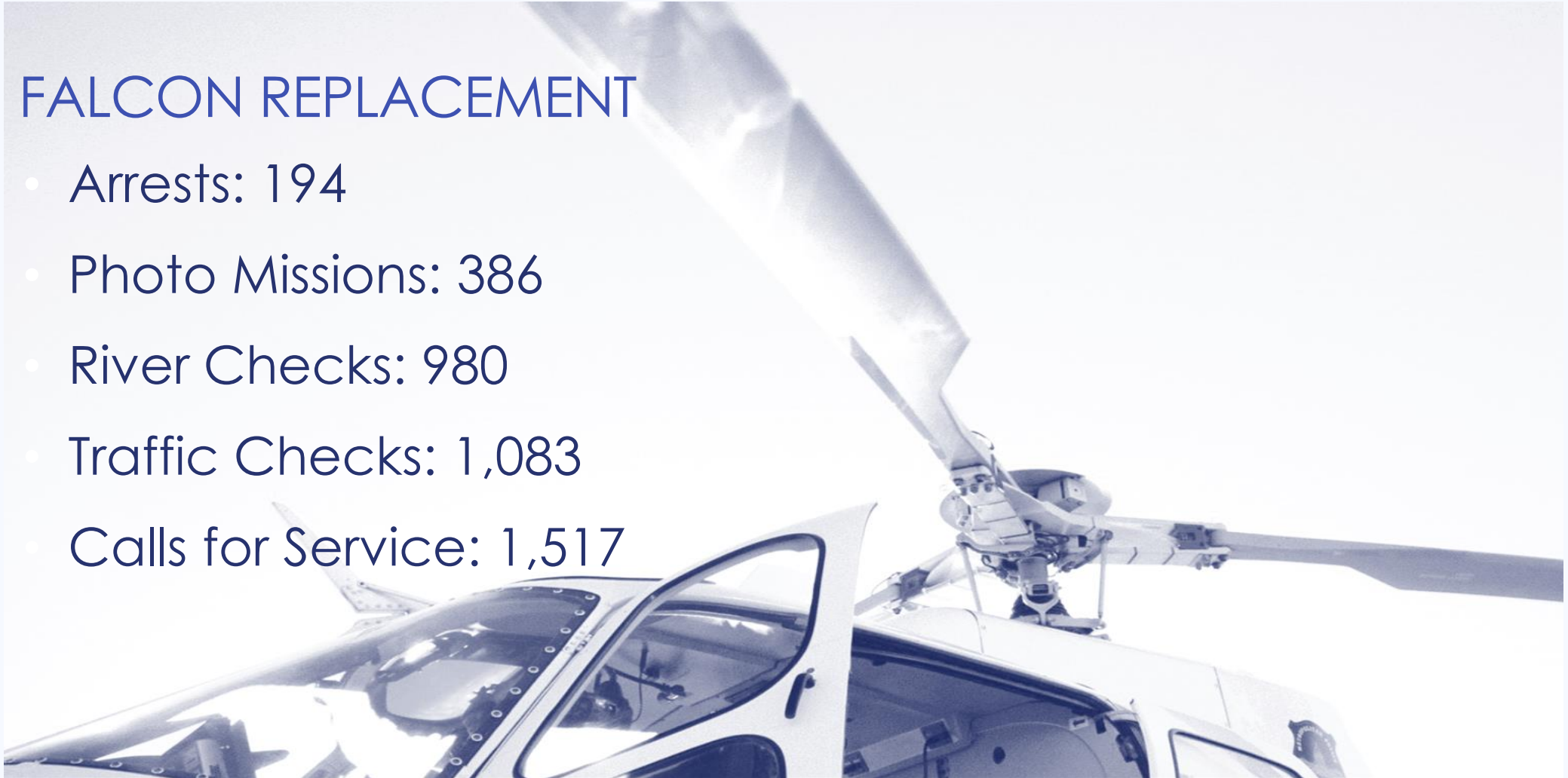
